

## Arizona Indian Education Association (AIEA) Student Scholarship

The scholarship will recognize American Indian youth who demonstrate exemplary achievement in academics, community service, and leadership, and who consistently participate in cultural activities. The goal of the AIEA Student Scholarship is to promote, encourage, and support students as they develop into scholars and prepare to engage in important careers as adults.

## Scholarship Criteria:

- Open to American Indian/Alaska Native students residing in <u>and</u> attending a school within Arizona in grades 7–12
- Open to American Indian/Alaska Native students residing in <u>and</u> attending a community college or University within Arizona and is an undergraduate or graduate student
- Enrolled member of a federally-recognized Indian Nation
- Demonstrates excellence, creativity, initiative and leadership in school, community and cultural activities
- Exemplifies the characteristics of a positive role model in his/her school and community

### 7th - 12th Grade Students:

• Must have a 2.0 GPA or above

## Community College/University Student:

- Must be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student with a minimum of 12 credit hours for current semester
- Must be enrolled as a full-time graduate student with minimum credit hours, as defined by graduate program, for current semester. (Please provide letter from your graduate college confirming your full-time status.)
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above

#### **Application Procedure:**

- 1. Complete the application form
- 2. Submit copy of tribal enrollment card/CIB from a federally-recognized Indian Nation
- 3. Include two (2) letters of recommendation from a teacher/professor, counselor/advisor, mentor, church leader or community leader.
- 4. Submit a copy of your current school transcripts. Unofficial copies are acceptable.

  Please note: Incoming high school freshmen are to provide Middle School/Junior High transcripts. Incoming freshman to college and/or university are to provide High School transcripts.
- 5. Submit a type-written double-spaced essay between 200 to 500 words on your perspective of "Strengthening Our Nations: Hear Our Voice", include:
  - a. Awards Received
  - **b.** Student government or Leadership positions
  - c. Extracurricular Activities (i.e. clubs, sports, community organizations, etc.)
  - d. Education/Career goals
    - If awarded, students must attend the Arizona Indian Education Association Educator's Banquet.
    - The Scholarship Review Committee will notify the awardees no later than November 30, 2018.
